

Good News as we start another week, with Hospitalizations and Mortality declining significantly over the weekend as well as a new low in New Cases on much larger testing volumes!

Hospitalizations continued a 6 day downward trend over the weekend with total hospitalizations at the lowest levels since late March. Daily Mortality has been on an 11 day downward trend as well and reached the lowest level yesterday since March 31st. In addition to these positive trends, new cases declined yesterday to the lowest level since March 30th(40+ days) as testing rose well beyond 300,000 new daily tests.

Let's get to the #'s:

Headlines:

- Testing Volumes appear to have grown yesterday well beyond 300,000, but we will need to confirm with another days data and additional sources.
- Total Hospitalizations declined materially and are now at late March levels in New York and elsewhere, prior to the new case surge.
- Daily Mortality has declined for 6 straight days, dropping to below 1,000 for the 1st time yesterday to 750.
- New Daily Case volumes declined to ~20,000 yesterday on significantly higher test volumes. This is the lowest New Case # since March 30th.
- Total Hospitalizations declined yesterday by ~1,600 cases across the US.
 - *Total Hospitalizations have dropped back to March levels in many of the major cities, including New York,*
 - *8 States have total current hospitalizations >2,000 and represent 60% of total US hospitalizations, led by Florida, New York, , Georgia, California, New Jersey, Illinois, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania,*
 - *10 states have >1,000 current cases (less than 2,000) led by Texas, Maryland, Michigan, Virginia and Indiana,*
 - *The remaining 33 States have on average less than 300 current hospital cases state wide, most rural and low population areas have ZERO current cases.*
- New Mortality was ~750 yesterday, continuing an overall 11 day decline in daily mortality.
 - *ONLY 2 States had mortality >100 yesterday; New York and Massachusetts at 146 and 139 respectively,*
 - *17 States had mortality 10-50 yesterday,*
 - *32 States had mortality <10 yesterday and 12 States had mortality of ZERO*

- Testing grew yesterday to >500,000 tests according to one of our sites, we will need to confirm with tomorrows data,
 - % of tests with positive outcomes declined to a new low of 4%, as new cases declined on materially higher testing volumes,
 - 11 States are performing > 5,000 tests per day and 9 States > 10,000 tests per day.
 - States leading in testing in order are; Florida (100,00+), New Jersey (100,000+) California (45,000+), New York (30,000+), Texas, Illinois , Michigan, Massachusetts
 - **Total testing to date is now ~9.4 Million across the US**
