

Work Play Love - Eric Discovers it All in Our Community

Eric Hung remembers waking up countless mornings screaming into his pillow throughout high school and university.

He had no reason for being anxious or unhappy, he notes. He wasn't bullied, he had great friends and the support of his family. The problem, he adds, "was that I had not found my passion yet and it was bugging me."

Eric, who got his first job in grade 5 delivering samples door to door, also delivered the Vancouver Sun on his bike six days a week from grades 6 to 8. In high school he worked at McDonald's, the Keg and found odd jobs around the neighbourhood from flyers he created.

He got his work ethic, he explains, from his dad Oliver who emigrated from Hong Kong for university in Toronto and met Eric's mother Marion. They moved to North Vancouver months after Eric was born and still reside there.

"My parents were wonderful role models who led by example and taught me that being respectful, humble and hardworking were important core values."

"I learned that I needed to be productive to be happy and was not afraid of the hard work it required," says Eric, Associate Wealth Advisor at The Eydt Wealth Advisory Group of RBC Dominion Securities in Edgemont Village.

Still, when it was time to go to university, he had no idea what he wanted to pursue. "My dad ran a successful engineering firm in Vancouver that provided well for our family. I was good at math and the sciences, so it seemed like a natural fit to follow in his footsteps."

However, he was not inspired by engineering.

"I remember one morning in third year university, while working at an aviation water purification company, I woke up and screamed into that unlucky pillow. That was when I knew I was not happy doing this for a summer, let alone the rest of my life."

Recalling a quote from Mark Cuban, the billionaire owner of the Dallas Mavericks basketball team, who once noted that a key to success and happiness was "knowing your core competencies and focusing on being great at them," it dawned on Eric that he had more to explore.

He finished mechanical engineering because, he hates leaving things unfinished, he explains. Connecting his desire to help people and his interest in finance and investments, Eric decided to give banking a try at the Bank of Montreal (BMO). In three years, he moved through the ranks to become the financial planner for the biggest branch on the North Shore.

"I started waking up looking forward to going to work six days a week. That was a refreshing feeling."

It showed in his performance, as he was one of the top Financial Planners nationally at BMO for seven years in a row. Still, he felt that something was missing.

At about the same time, he found his personal passion when he started adventure racing, which includes mountain biking, trail running and kayaking. It allowed him to push his body to the limits and master endurance sports.

"On top of spending all my free

time training, my whole social life revolved around these sports. I developed lifelong friendships as well as a sense of community. We would race up the Grouse Grind, trying to be the first at the patio so we could watch the others finish while sipping a beer."

In 2004, Eric met his wife, Tamara, a professional jazz singer. "We were inseparable from the week we met. We could count the number of days we hadn't seen each other over the first two years on one hand."

The couple got married on the beach in Cabos San Lucas, Mexico, and settled into post honeymoon bliss with their puppy Lucy, spending weekends hiking through the Capilano River trails.

That groove was shaken up when Tamara was offered the opportunity to sing full time in Asia.

"I initially resisted," says Eric, "but when I realized this was a unique opportunity I jumped at the chance to take a pause from 'reality' and take a trip of a lifetime with the love of my life."

They spent almost a year in Macau, Hong Kong, Thailand, Cambodia and Indonesia. Eric notes that the

She is loving and cuddly and happiest when there's a good tune to dance along to, says Eric.

Tamara, who was the event manager for the YWCA's Women of Distinction Awards

before maternity leave, is back as a Fund Development Manager at the YWCA. Her passion outside of work includes CrossFit, running, teaching yoga and preparing healthy, homemade food for their family. She's also training to become a teacher for Girlvana, programs aimed at helping teenage girls find and embrace their inner voice to become strong leaders.

light up my life."

In 2011, he traded in his adventure racing gear for a road bike, participating in the Ride to Cancer in support of a friend who had lost his dad.

"Adventure racing was exciting but hard on the body and I was struggling with injuries. The minute I stepped onto a road bike, my body and mind were happy."

Over the last seven years he's been racing and volunteering as a ride leader for Steed Cycles and is now competing at the highest level of local amateur Master's racing (age 30+). Highlights from last year include riding more than 12,000 km, winning one of the biggest local road races, Race the Ridge, and placing fourth at the Master's Road Race Nationals held at UBC.

"Most people think cycling is an individual sport, but all my results are due to the help of my team. The Steed Ride Club and Race Team have been great ways to meet people who share similar passions and goals."

Setting goals is important, but Eric says he has learned that the key to his happiness lies in how he sets goals and prioritizes his resources.

"It would be great if we had all the money and time in the world to do everything we want to do to the fullest, but that's not realistic."

Planning out those resources and having an understanding with everyone involved is critical to achieving balance.

"My objectives are not results based anymore, they are based on enjoying the journey," he adds.
